### LAKE TO LAKE QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING, Gorham, NY – December 6, 2017

Meeting called to order 9:20; minutes approved by consensus, no changes.  
Cheryl Jordan asked to see details regarding expenses and deposits; Faith Harris explained she does this already in her reports to the members and spreadsheets. Checking account at \$3,918.72 and savings at \$10,423.17.

The Insurance Policy was renewed, and Faith Harris will again speak with the agent to have the address change verified for mailing of policy and billing.

There was brief discussion about sparse attendance at the sit and sew; asking for payment in advance, a fee of \$5 from each member planning to attend would go toward room rent.

Member at Large Mary Grimaldi spoke about a new member's question leading to a broader idea. Mary had been asked about how a new member could identify which guild members interested quilting specialties. A survey of members

could be used to identify members who are proficient in certain skills so members wishing to learn more would know who to ask. A detailed draft survey was distributed. Results would be used to build a Talent Directory, promoting the guild's goals of learning new skills, socializing and having some fun while quilting.

QCNYS passports now available at \$5 each. There may be opportunity for the guild to hire the teacher who will be at QCNYS meeting in September 2018, such as was done last year.

Quilt Show: 4 vendors are returning, and others will again offer a coupon. There are some legalities about sale of fabric from the Canadian teacher who will be presenting at the show. Purchases could be made on line since the US vendor is in NYC and unlikely to travel to vend here. Raffle tickets available now. There was discussion regarding the gift gallery, including the format for the fee and the location of the tables.

Afternoon programs were discussed; Gail Williams presented results in order of popularity, based on survey of members. She stressed those who Sign Up need to Show Up.

Modern Quilt lecture and trunk show as after meeting program; Education fund could be used; an all-day class is possible with local Rochester area teachers and presenters.

Quilting on home sewing machine: can be in June, and all-day class would have an expense

Making full size quilt, either Bargello or Flying geese

Making a table runner, if do before June could use as the home machine quilt project

Aprons: after meeting class in March to have ready to wear at quilt show; any pattern could be used.

Care of Quilts, after meeting class; would be an expense, to bring local Rochester teacher.

Christmas ornament (quilted or wool, not beaded) could be scheduled for October.

In July, instead of a meeting, there are plans to make a pin cushion out of roving, including some dyeing.

UFO challenge will start in January: Bring to show and tell when done and keep track to be eligible for a prize.

Meeting adjourned at 10:05.

#### **LAKE TO LAKE QUILT GUILD Gorham, NY December 6, 2017 Membership Meeting**

Meeting was called to order by President Flo Meredith at 10:12 with the Pledge of Allegiance.

A thank you card for baby quilts from Newark Wayne Hospital was read.

A motion to approve minutes was made by Martha Mosher, seconded by Bobbi Beckhorn and approved without objection or abstention.

Treasurer Faith Harris announced Checking account at \$3,918.72 and savings at \$10,423.17. At prior meeting, the draft 2018 budget was introduced. The anticipated website expense increase is due to the two-year internet host fee. A motion to approve the budget was made by Bobbi Beckhorn, seconded by Sally Kasulke and approved without objection or abstention.

Vice President Dawn Dennis noted a Geneva Finger Lakes Times newspaper article about Quilts of Valor which featured guild member Sally Kasulke. She also noted that there was fabric on the "sale table" donated from Beth McMinn's fabric free of charge to guild members. She also read a sewing hint about half square triangles and a story about a small Christmas tree.

Fat Quarter drawing won by Marie Peek.

There was discussion about Bridget Zimmerman's idea for a survey to create a Talent Directory. She has volunteered to tabulate the results. Survey will be sent with January's newsletter.

QCNYS: Bobbi Beckhorn has new Passports for \$5; she gave each new member a passport. Next QCNYS meeting will be in March, location TBD. The Challenge paperwork is due 1-1-18 on line. QCNYS site password is log cabin.

There are 47 paid members to date; list will circulate during meeting so that members can make any corrections needed before list is published in January.

Quilt show: Vendors are returning. Rack cards are made up for distribution to quilt shops. Raffle tickets and a rack card are available from Donna Coleman; each member is asked to sell at least 12 tickets. Pricing is \$1 per ticket or 6 tickets for \$10. Packets were distributed to each member with entry information and instructions. Guild will pay Gennie Barnes to offer a constructive critique of quilts for interested members who sign up. She will appraise quilts for about \$45 each, slightly less for second quilt.

Signup sheets are being filled in; members should volunteer for specific tasks and time shifts at the show.

Gail Williams presented information about the 2018 afternoon programs.

June: definite program scheduled for quilting on home machine by Caren Belinsky

before June: making table runners to use for home machine quilting project.

Modern Quilting: trunk show after a meeting

March: Aprons, sew to wear at quilt show in May

Care of Quilts, after meeting program on storage, repair, etc.

Making a full-size quilt, possibly an all-day session, using bargello or flying geese as theme.

Christmas ornament, quilted or wool, after meeting

Handwork, after meeting, a mini class with members sharing their special talents and interests

By informal vote, the membership indicated the most interest in:

Modern quilting trunk show afternoon, with possible full day class; Apron afternoon; Care for Quilt afternoon.

Interest was mixed for table runner as a whole day event.

The church is available on 3rd Wednesdays or on Thursdays.

Cheryl Jordan reminded members about the Schweinfurth Museum show in Auburn, noting that internationally recognized art quilts will be included, and a second textile exhibit is upstairs. First Fridays are free admission.

There was an intermission to show projects made for the 2.5-inch strip challenge.

Discussion resumed at 11:45 regarding the quilt show.

Members were asked to donate books and magazines to sell.

There will not be an interactive quilt or memorial area as were featured last time.

There was significant discussion regarding the gift gallery, including the fee structure and the location of the tables. It was noted that people do purchase high quality and unusual items. Moving the gallery closer to the food area and QCNY table would yield more space for vendors whose fees are used to underwrite educational expenses. A motion was made, then withdrawn regarding location of gift gallery table noting some confusion regarding decision making authority. This issue and the fee structure will be taken up by the gift gallery committee, Marcie Williams and Paula Schultz, who will work with show co-chairs, Bobbi Beckhorn and Sally Acomb.

Meeting was adjourned on motion by Caren Betlinski, second by Sandi Minster; all in favor. Show and Tell, Fat Quarter exchange, and the luncheon followed.
